NATURAL DISASTERS



Earthquake. Myanmar and Thailand (March 2025)

Consequence: killed more than 5700 people



Flood. Bangladesh (August 2024) and Bolivia (March 2025)

Consequence: mass evacuations and loss of life





NATURAL DISASTERS



Hurricanes Helene and Milton. US (September, October 2024)

Consequence: destroyed infrastructure



Forest fires. US, California (January 2025)

Consequence: damaged 250,000 hectares of forests





MAN-MADE DISASTERS



The destruction of the Kakhovka hydroelectric power plant dam. Ukraine (June 2023)

Consequence: flooding of 600 km² of territory with 80 settlements



Hitting the protective shelter of the destroyed Unit 4 of the Chernobyl nuclear power plant. Ukraine (February 2025)

Consequence: radiation accident of unpredictable scale was avoided





ENVIRONMENTAL CONSEQUENCES OF WAR

Environmental disasters have no borders!







The hostilities in Ukraine have dealt a devastating blow to the environment, increasing its vulnerability to natural disasters and exacerbating the problems caused by climate change

On 27 May 2024, the XII EUROSAI
Congress decided to extend the
mandate of the Working Group on the
Audit of Funds Allocated to Disasters
and Catastrophes. The Congress also
decided to extend the chairmanship
of the Accounting Chamber (Ukraine)
in the Working Group



In 2024, the activity of the EUROSAI
Working Group is aimed at both
completing the implementation
of the activities set out in the
Working Group's Strategic Plan
for 2021–2024 and launching the
implementation of the Working Group's
Strategic Plan for 2024–2027





In fact, by May 2024, the results of the implementation of the Working Group's Strategic Plan for 2021–2024 were summed up, which was implemented in three steps

EXCHANGE OF BEST PRACTICES IN THIS AREA

In April 2024, a plenary session was held on "Key Achievements", during which the participants discussed the implementation of recommendations based on the results of international coordinated audits conducted within the framework of the Working Group



Speakers presented both successful cases of implementation of the recommendations and remaining challenges



The main focus was on the need to improve strategic planning, interagency coordination and increased control over the implementation of environmental and safety standards





EXCHANGE OF BEST PRACTICES IN THIS AREA

The exchange of information and lessons learned is vital for each SAI, as it broadens horizons and opens up a new perspective on the actions of its own government in comparison to others. Therefore, in 2024, the members of the EUROSAI working group prepared a Joint Report on the results of the parallel audit of forest fire protection



The **purpose** of the parallel audit was to assess the state of forest management and the effectiveness of measures aimed at preventing, preparing for and fighting forest fires in three countries: Georgia, Lithuania and Ukraine







EXCHANGE OF BEST PRACTICES IN THIS AREA

These countries have different forest areas, terrain and forest cover. This affects approaches to forest management, conservation, protection and use

At the same time, forest fires remain a significant challenge for Ukraine (especially during the period of Russia's open military aggression against Ukraine, which has been ongoing since February 2022), as well as for Georgia and Lithuania

Thus, international cooperation and effective implementation of audit recommendations are key to improving the management of natural and man-made disasters, ensuring environmental safety and adapting to global challenges

In 2010 **Ukraine** had

Total forest area:

10.4 million hectares

Forests cover approximately

15 % of the country's territory

In 2010 **Georgia** had

Total forest area: **2.99 million hectares**

Forests cover approximately
43 % of the country's territory

In 2010 **Lithuania** had

Total forest area:

2.2 million hectares

Forests cover approximately **33,7** % of the country's territory

From 2001 to 2023, Ukraine lost

1.26 Mha of tree cover

101 kha of tree cover from wildfires

From 2001 to 2023, Georgia lost

11.9 kha of tree cover

1,79 kha of tree cover from wildfires

From 2001 to 2023, **Lithuania** lost

420 kha of tree cover

1,75 kha of tree cover from wildfires

STEP 2. Preventing disasters

In the context of growing global challenges such as climate change and natural disasters, disaster prevention is becoming increasingly important



The Working Group's members are focused on researching the prevention of man-made and natural disasters, identifying the most pressing risk areas, maximising the attention of governments to the identified problems, and developing and providing effective

recommendations to the SAIs to address them



In order to achieve this strategic goal, the plenary session "Looking to the Future" was held, during which we developed and approved the Strategic Plan of the EUROSAI Working Group on the Audit of Funds Allocated to Disasters and Catastrophes for 2024–2027. This plan was subsequently approved by the EUROSAI Congress





STEP 3. Effective external communication



Effective external communication is a key element of our Working Group's activities. The efforts of the SAIs — members of the Working Group — are aimed at improving the external communication of the Working Group with stakeholders, raising awareness of its activities, as well as attracting maximum attention of the wider community to the problems in the activities of the Working Group



STEP 3. Effective external communication

In order to improve external communication, the Working Group is establishing cooperation with the Working Group on Disaster Management within the framework of the Sustainable Development Goals of the Latin American Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions (OLACEFS)





The initiative aims to contribute to the development of effective tools for better disaster risk management.

The cooperation within INTOSAI between EUROSAI and OLACEFS will enable a higher level of disaster preparedness and contribute to a more resilient world

WHAT WE HAD DONE YET




Work continues on drafting new guidance documents, including:

- Practical recommendations on audits of probable losses and minimisation of negative consequences of disasters
